Online Training Programme on Child Centric Disaster Risk Reduction

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BACKGROUND

Recently the Ministry of Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India has issued guidelines for re-opening of school from 15 October 2020, keeping in background the Disaster Management Act, 2005. At this time of COVID 19, children are the biggest victims affected by the global pandemic. Shreds of evidence posit that a range of health and psychological risks engendered due to closures of school and children related services. Moreover, the impacts of harmful effects of COVID 19 are most damaging for children belonging to the marginalised sections who are already in a vulnerable situation. Children and their families are experiencing a range of ordeals due to the lockdown of the economy, closure of institutions meant for children and limited or no access to healthcare and other essential services required for children. The available evidence indicates the direct impact of COVID-19 on child and adolescent mortality to be very limited, but the indirect effects on child survival stemming from strained health systems, household income loss, and disruptions to care-seeking and preventative interventions like vaccination may be substantial and widespread across the world (UNISEF, 2020). In India, to contain the upcoming exigencies during this unlocking procedure a proper training and capacity building related to Child Centric Disaster Risk Reduction is the need of the hour.

COVID-19 has put a huge challenge in training and capacity building in terms of constraints related to social distancing. Training and awareness-building during new normal situations require an alternative and effective arrangement for timely COVID-19 response. Training at the time of pandemic is widely considered to be a powerful instrument for building the capacities of functionaries by enhancing and upgrading their knowledge, skills and competencies on a regular and periodic basis. At this crucial time, training through online modules can be a liberator for building capacities of stakeholders serving the children directly or indirectly.

Keeping in view the increasing vulnerability of children to disasters, M. P. Institute of Social Science Research, Ujjain (An Autonomous Institute of ICSSR, New Delhi) in collaboration with the National Institute of Disaster Management (Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India) is conducting an Online Training Programme on 'Child Centric Disaster Risk Reduction' (CCDRR) for the Central States during 02 to 04 November 2020.

OBJECTIVES

At the end of this online course, participants will be able to:

- Comprehend an overview of the sectoral impacts of disaster on children.
- Understand the process of CCDRR and its steps including mainstreaming approaches.
- Provide an overview of CCDRR with an emphasis on Life Cycle Approaches and Risk-Informed Programming.
- Strategies to involve children in DRR activities.
- Building knowledge on school safety.
- Basic information on COVID-19 and emerging issues related to children's well-being.
- The adverse impact of closures, social distancing and lockdowns on children's education and how to address them.
- Explain the disaster Impact on the mental health of children.

PARTICIPANTS

This Three Day Online Training Programme on 'Child Centric Disaster Risk Reduction' (02-04, November 2020) is meant for service providers of children in various governmental and non-governmental organisation, civil society practitioners, teachers, researcher and students to build their knowledge, skills and perspectives towards child-centric disaster risk reduction. This will help the stakeholders to understand and prepare for risk-informed planning, sectoral readiness and preparedness for emergencies so as children are not be deprived of basic amenities during disasters.
